

2010 Civic Betterment Party Town Meeting Minutes

The 2010 Civic Betterment Party Town Meeting was held Saturday, December 4, 2010 at the Glen Ellyn Civic Center. President Lee Crumbaugh called the meeting to order at 10:55 am.

Following a flag ceremony by the St. Petronille Boy Scout Troop, Secretary Heather Kummerer read the minutes of the 2008 Town Meeting. The members present approved the minutes.

In the absence of Treasurer Sylvia Bartlett, President Crumbaugh gave the Treasurer's report. The balance at the beginning of the fall was \$2,216.77; donations to meeting date were \$3610; expenses to date \$4,311.20; and Town Meeting costs were expected to be \$1,100. The ending balance was \$415.57. After noting the need for additional donations and indicating how to donate, the report was approved.

The floor was then opened for nominations for Civic Betterment Party Officers and Nominating Committee members. Nominated were Lee Crumbaugh for President; Erik Ford for Nominating Committee Chair; Kathy Burket for Treasurer; and committee member nominations Ron Repking, Mike Klingele, Kent Erikson, Dan Kelly, Steve Butkus, Joe Sinopole, Chris Wilson, Paul Isaac, Sheila Kennedy. Nominations were closed and voting instructions provided.

Library Board Candidates were then presented for the four openings. Nominated by the Nominating Committee were: Maryl Wesolowski, Sharon Weber, John Mulherin, and Bob McClow. No additional nominations were given from the floor.

Village Trustee Candidates were then presented. Nominated by the Nominating Committee were: Luke Sanna, Lyn Whiston, Robert Friedberg, and JP Anderson. As requested Trustee candidates Pete Ladesic and Diane McGinley were nominated from the floor. Both nominations were seconded from the floor.

No nominee for Village Clerk was presented at this meeting. Nominations for all offices were closed.

Each of the six Village Trustee candidates then gave a speech describing his or her qualifications followed by the Library Trustee candidate speeches. Polls remained open until 4:00 pm. The ballots were counted and all results announced and posted online on the CBP site. Village Trustee candidates elected were: Pete Ladesic, Robert Friedberg, and Diane McGinley.

Being no further business, President Crumbaugh adjourned the meeting at 8:pm.
